News from our Pastor

Dear CCC Family and Friends,

Since our last newsletter, much has happened in the life of the church. In addition to the spring Stable Sale and God's Kids Choir performance, we have had baptisms, upcoming staff transitions, and opportunities for new ministries and connections.

In terms of baptisms, our latest class of ten youth, baptized this past Sunday on Pentecost morning, left me filled with both hope and joy. Darla and I spent Friday and Saturday with the baptismal candidates, reflecting with them on the meaning and call of discipleship. I mentioned Sunday morning that their insights, articulation of faith, and zest for living are impressive. They used such

words as "mystical, majestic, mysterious, compassionate, loving, and personal," when asked to describe God in one word. They have a seemingly unending amount of energy. And they want to belong to something that is greater that the individual self, which, perhaps more than anything else, struck me as a surprise. Our recently baptized youth, despite whatever the news may say about the upcoming "me" generation rooted in the narcissism of the self, is anything but. Rather, they yearn, at least here at CCC, to be a part of the body of Christ and the church, making a difference in their lives and the lives of others. For this, I am very thankful.

In terms of upcoming staff transitions, our beloved Jimmy Spear, after twelve years of faithful and dedicated service, has announced that he plans to retire (he will still substitute occasionally at CCC) in order to spend more time with grandchildren, family, and friends. We will miss Jimmy deeply. A celebration, in his honor, will be held immediately following the service on June 12th.

And in terms of new ministries and connections to the greater community, CCC plans to be present this year at the Ballwin Days Festival. Ballwin Days, a celebration in our community that has taken place for the past thirty-nine years, is June 10th-12th. This year, with the gracious financial support of the Disciples Women, we are going to have a booth! The details are still in the works. But here are some of the initial plans:

We will highlight one of the ministries that CCC does best, Vacation Bible School. Our plan is to have a table (along with a tent), with children activities/crafts that highlight the theme of VBS, Surf Shack. We will have games that give away prizes such as sunglasses, beach balls, and even drawings for several children to attend VBS for free. We will also have a big water cooler and dixie cups available for anyone, adults included, who need to relax and take a break.

We would love to have your support and, if it works with your schedule, your physical presence and help. Our tent will be setup and operating from 12:00-5:00 on Saturday and Sunday afternoon. There will be a sign-up sheet in the narthex. If you have any questions, please contact me or Janet Staicoff. This is just one more way that we can be church beyond the church, connecting with our neighbors and friends.

As you can see, we have a lot taking place. Yet, while we are busy, we are also intentional-trying our best to both be and make disciples. I'm glad we are on the journey with one another.

Mission in Action at CCC-Updates from our Mission First Team

CCC has adopted The Knoeble Girls Dorm at Epworth Children's Home! These are the "high risk" girls that go to school within their own dorm and do not leave the campus.

The contact people for our group are Molly Duncan, Tracey Hammack, and Lisa Belue. We have submitted our paperwork and were approved as continuous volunteers with the dorm. We will plan at least one activity per month with the girls. Each visit is usually about an hour or two depending on the activity and the current

situation within the dorm as it can change hourly! We also plan to send cards, etc to the girls during the month to let them know we are thinking of them or to celebrate a holiday or birthday if applicable. We may also have the opportunity to have a bigger event where other members of the congregation can come and participate as well.

Molly and Lisa had their first visit on Saturday, May 14th. Molly prepared a craft where the girls used t-shirts to make their own tote bags and Lisa brought art supplies as well. They also brought some sweet snacks to share and those were a hit with the girls! The girls shared ideas of what they would like to do when they get together and also what their favorite foods are which will help us plan for future visits.

When we spoke with Margaret, the volunteer coordinator, this week, she let us know that they are looking for adult volunteers to help coordinate their Christmas Adopt-A-Child program. The volunteers would help gather the needs for each child, communicate the information to the committee, and organize the collection and distribution of the gifts to each child. For many of the children, these are the only gifts they will receive. Lisa has adopted a child from Epworth each year for the past few years and it is a great program.

Epworth has another need that we think would be a great way for CCC to help out: they are trying to set up a small "store" where the youth could earn points and then redeem them for items from the store. The items they are wishing for are for the most part inexpensive and easy to purchase. We are discussing the possibility of the youth group holding an "item drive" or some way to collect so we can help them stock their store.

As you can see, even if you are unable to commit to a regular date with the Epworth residents there are many other ways for interested members so help out and make a difference in the kids' lives!
