#### Dear CCC Family,

Over the last few weeks, we have spent a lot of time thinking, visioning, reflecting, discussing, and now voting on what the future of our worship services and church life will be. It has been an intriguing process. Dialogue is critical. Dialogue without opposition is not true dialogue. And dialogue with opposing views, when led appropriately (as we have done), can lead to even greater growth. The deepest lesson I have taken away from this process is that the CCC family as a whole is grateful, and thankful, to be in constant worship with those who are the same, different, more conservative, less conservative, more liberal, less liberal, older, younger, on the same religious path, or on a totally different path. What has echoed throughout is the desire of all to maintain our diversity-celebrating what we share in common, recognizing the ways we differ, and always welcoming everyone to the table of God every Sunday. No matter what the final vote tally is, whether we have one service or two, we will be just fine and even stronger for having been intentional about what it is God is calling us to do.

In terms of staffing, let me give a brief update.

We have hired a new organist/pianist, Sarah Nelson. Sarah joined us for the first time this past Sunday and did an excellent job. We look forward to welcoming her into our congregation and celebrating with her through the gift of music.

In terms of the next associate minister or youth minister/director, we are still in a process of discernment, both in what we are searching for and what best meets our

current needs. We have collected several profiles and resumes; the candidates are all qualified and personable. We are holding an interview this week, with a candidate who could possibly serve in either an interim or more permanent position. But there has been no final decision on whether this candidate, or any other candidate, will be part-time or full-time, permanent or interim. There are a number of issues to consider and we want to make the most appropriate choice, while being timely but not rushed. If you have any suggests/comments/thoughts please feel free, as always, to contact me or any member of our leadership team. We will continue to update as the process unfolds.

Finally, I want to say just a word about youth ministry in general. Last night, I led our CCC youth group for the first time. Youth ministry was where I started my ministerial career. And I was reminded once again how critical youth ministry is. Yes, youth are the future of our church. But equally important, if not more so, is the fact that the youth are, right now, a valued and active part of the church. Our job, or calling, as adults, is to help mentor these youth—teaching our youth to think theologically. Yet, at the same time, our job, as adults, is to learn from our youth-seeing, listening, and hearing new ways to think theologically. It's a two-way street and without one another, we would be less the richer.

Only through our individuality can we come together to compose the totality of the body of Christ.



### An update from Facilities and Finance:

Dear CCC Family and Friends,

In the July issue of the Vital Spark I wrote to inform you that through careful stewardship of your pledges and gifts for 2016, CCC had a slight surplus at mid-year. I also cautioned, however, that the surplus was primarily the result of lower than projected expenses and higher than expected WFLC rental income during that time period.

This month I want to share with you some extraordinary and unbudgeted expenses we will incur during the second half of 2016 that are likely to create a period of deficit spending best covered by increased giving from the congregation. These expenses must also be viewed in light of general offering levels that have not kept pace with projected income over the summer months.

The major property and facility issues with a total cost of approximately \$18,000 that have been addressed include:

- Replacement of a 22-year-old air conditioner and furnace
- Removal and/or deadwood trimming of several trees that have been wind-damaged or hit by lighting and pose a danger to CCC property or neighboring property
- Replacement of two outside doors for DeWitt Hall and repair of two additional doors in Lower Packwood.

God sees the giving heart of each of us and blesses us because we give out of love for our church and our community. We ask that you prayerfully consider your financial gifts, support and talents over the remainder of 2016 as we work to continue providing the beautiful, safe and sound worship space we enjoy at CCC. On behalf of the Facilities and Finance Committee, I thank each and every one of you for your continuing

commitment to Community Christian.
