“I give in order for my spirit to be generous.”



Distributed Expense Comparisons



Important Financial Information:

- General offering contributions account for 96% of our revenue.
- Salaries for our pastor and staff have been assigned on a percentage basis to the appropriate church ministry group.
- We anticipate needs of \$18,000 per year for future replacement of HVAC equipment.
- Debt Service represents interest and principal payments and excludes extra principal payments by Disciples Women in the amount of \$37,400 in 2016 and \$37,500 in 2015. Our monthly mortgage payment is \$4,454, of which approximately \$1,350 per month is interest and the remainder is applied to reduce the loan balance.
- Service and Mission excludes money received for special offerings, food donations to Circle of Concern and financial support to outside agencies by Disciples Women, Disciples Men, Children’s Ministry and the Elders. Those donations are \$19,850 so far in 2016 and \$21,831 in 2015.

In such a time as this, how can I give?

Three Different Options:

Become a new giver.

Giving back to God can be a spiritual exercise, recognizing that God has first given to us. We are not asking simply for money, but rather for money that enables us to do ministry. Any amount, from small to large, helps us live out the teachings of our faith and bring healing to a fractured world.

Become a pledged giver.

If you are a regular giver but do not pledge, please consider doing so. A pledge is not a legally binding contract, but rather a tool that helps our finance and facilities team plan for the upcoming year and budget. All pledges are kept strictly confidential.

Become even more financially generous.

Many people measure wealth by how much money they possess. Another measurement of wealth is how much an individual can give. Some already give the greatest amount they can, for this we give thanks to God. But if you are in a position to give an even greater financial gift, please pray about this possibility—asking God if this is right for you. Together, each gift that we give will help bring about the kingdom of God.
