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#### A Message from our Senior Pastor

Dear CCC Family,

This Sunday we are kicking off a new sermon series that focuses on the promises of God. One of the promises of God is the promise of a new identity, a new identity that embraces us with the gift of the Holy Spirit the moment we are baptized.

In reflecting on what it means to have a new identity, and the work that is taking place at CCC as we move forth with Agile Church, I spent time this week thinking about mission and vision statements. I found myself googling mission statements of successful businesses. And I discovered that the mission statement very rarely focuses solely on what the company is trying to sell or make a profit on. For example, Starbucks says its mission is "to inspire and nurture the human spirit—one person, one cup, and one neighborhood at a time." So when you walk into your local Starbucks the goal is not to sell you the most coffee, or the most expensive coffee, but rather to nurture and inspire the human spirit in everything that you experience at a Starbucks café.

When we think of our mission in our own faith journeys, individually and collectively, what is most important?

A lawyer asked Jesus, "Rabbi, what is the greatest commandment."

The Jews had 613 commandments to follow. But Jesus answers right away, "You shall love the Lord your God will all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." And then, says Jesus, "The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment than these."

In other words, our mission, my mission, your mission, the core of who we are and how we define our lives is to love Jesus and love one another. Over the past few days I have witnessed this love as sixteen people have stepped forth and volunteered to partner with us in serving Columbia Elementary in North St. Louis. This is in addition to the many thousands of acts of love that already take place at CCC.

As we move into the future, it is my hope, and my prayer, that what we will unconditionally and completely love one another, just as God loves us.

May our identity, as followers of Christ, be rooted in the love of God always and forever.

# Open and Affirming Group Task Force

Back in the Fall of 2016 (compelled by the Pulse Nightclub shootings in Orlando) two church members attended an ecumenical workshop entitled "Building An Inclusive Church". After the workshop, they began having conversations with CCC members and over several months discovered that others in the congregation also felt the spirit moving in the direction of widening the welcome of our church. Earlier this summer, the OAG (Open and Affirming Group) Task Force met for the first time.

The OAG is made up of persons in our congregation who have a heart and passion for the full inclusion of our LGBTQ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Questioning) children, teens and adults into the life of our congregation. The task force will shepherd an intentional time of prayer, Bible study, sharing of our stories, community building and reflection to discern if this is where God is calling our congregation. This process may take as few as six months or as long as several years.

What does it mean to be an Open and Affirming congregation?

A Disciples of Christ congregation that declares itself Open and Affirming welcomes persons of all gender expressions and sexual orientations to the table of Christ's communion and to the full life and leadership of the Church **AND** makes a public witness to the Mission of the Open and Affirming Ministry Program.\*

The task force plans to provide periodic updates to the congregation through newsletter articles and email updates. #### Children's Programs for the Fall

#### Child Care during Adult Sunday School

All children from newborn through 3rd grade are welcome to be in the Nursery during the Adult Sunday School hour.

#### **During Worship**

All children newborn to preschool are welcome in the Nursery at any time.

Those children in kindergarten to 3rd grade, should sit with their family during the start of worship. They are welcome to come forward for the Children's Moment, then after the Children's Moment they may choose to sit with their family for the rest of worship or be dismissed to go downstairs for a short Sunday School lesson. The children who choose to go to Sunday School will return to worship at Communion time.

Children in 4th and 5th grades are welcome to come up front for the Children's Moment and should then return to sit with their family for the rest of worship.

#### Adult and Youth Help is Needed

To make Sunday School time possible for children, we need adult volunteers to teach a 30 minute lesson (using curriculum provided) to children during worship once every six weeks. We also need youth volunteers (6th to 12th grad) to be helpers during the children's Sunday school time. We would need them once a month/every six weeks.
