A Message from our Senior Pastor

Dear CCC Family and Friends,

Tuesday morning...two early morning pastoral visits at two different hospitals...two different medical conditions...one shared commonality—the thankfulness for the prayers, cards, visits, and friends of Community Christian Church. Our Community practices community.

As we enter into Holy Week, we are reminded of the need to stay connected and be in relationship with one another. One of Jesus' greatest pains on the cross was the pain of abandonment both by his disciples and by God. This same pain continues today. Study after study shows that even though we are more connected now than ever before—think cell phones, technology and computers—we are also more lonely and isolated than ever before.

One of the primary characteristics of Christian discipleship is simply showing up for one another. What makes the church the church, and what makes the community the community, are the gathered children of God. For sure, there are different methods of gathering individuals together and all sorts of books, resources, and consultants to help make it happen. But the bottom line stays the same, people have to show up with and for one another.

And what happens when you come to church one Sunday after another, one year after another? The answer: You develop a sense of community.

There will be times when the worship service moves you to tears. There will be times when the conversation with fellow friends leads to a deeper relationship. There will be times when the pastor says something that doesn't sit well or the person sitting next to you supports a movement for something you do not understand. And there will be times when someone will send you a card, give you a call, or let you know that you are kept in their prayers.

All of this, in the midst of the messy and magical, is what it means to show up, practice community, and follow Jesus with one another.

I'm thankful for this Community and the ways we connect with one another and with God.

UPDATE FROM FINANCE TEAM

Giving year to date was down \$2,800, in these first two winter months. However, expenses were under budget by \$8,600, resulting in a positive bottom line.

The balance sheet continues to reflect healthy balances in checking accounts, reserves, and some restricted endowment funds.

Full monthly payments on the loan continue and additional gifts are being received to be applied to the principal. Recent loan debt was \$363,793.

Monthly progress will continue to be carefully reviewed throughout the year.

Thanks to Beth Bean for providing the many financial reports which provide a good picture of the church's finances.
