### A Message from our Senior Pastor

Dear CCC Family and Friends,

As we continue our year-long process of transformation and clarification about who we are and who we want to be, I want to update you on what has taken place and what will take place. Last fall, more than eighty individuals participated in our dream team small groups. The groups, as the title suggests, dreamed, through a series of conversations, about the future of our church and the ways in which God is speaking to CCC right now.

The results of these conversations were summarized and collated in a day long Saturday meeting in January with Coy James, our consultant from Agile Church. A copy of this summary can be found in this issue of the Vital Spark.

The next step of the process falls to the vision and mission team. This team, which will be consecrated at worship this coming Sunday and will meet with Coy all day on April 28<sup>th</sup>, includes: Brian Degitz-Fries, Laura McDurmont, Matt Mohr, Tanya Pereira, Pam Welker, and Leon Whitney. I will also serve on the team. Together, rooted in prayer and the Holy Spirit, we will create a new vision and mission statement for the church. These statements will then be presented to the church and voted on for approval by the entire congregation.

If the new vision and mission statements are approved by the congregation, we will then begin reviewing all of our ministries and missions. The ultimate goal is to have our new vision and mission statements align with the ministries of our faith community.

Please share with me any questions, thoughts, concerns, or suggestions you may have regarding this process. I am here to serve God and to serve you.

I feel comfortable with how the process is unfolding and hope you do as well.

I look forward to seeing you on our Service Sunday. Worship at 9:00, followed by service projects, and then a community meal at 5:00.
