#### MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

Dear CCC Friends and Family,

As I write this letter, and look out the window of my home office, I can see the leaves of some of the trees beginning to turn. Trees never cease to amaze me.

I recently came across a novel called "The Overstory," by mistake. This rather lengthy book, by the author Richard Powers, was sitting on my parents' coffee table. After reading the first few pages, and becoming immersed in the field of environmental fiction (a new genre to me), I was convinced that I was reading a writer who belongs in the same ranks as Herman Melville and other great American writers.

Though he is not as well known, Richard Powers, through the lives of nine major characters, paints the canopy of America's landscape in past, present, and future. The heroes of the story are not the humans, but the trees. The trees are in constant conversation and communication with one another. Trees can warn one another about potential disaster, disease or decay. Trees are rooted together underneath the soil, intertwining with one another, and fighting their greatest opponent (humankind). When one tree is cut down, other trees mourn and are weakened.

Powers is a master at personification. And while "The Overstory" is a novel about trees, it is also a novel about how to live.

This fall, while we are not going to have a sermon series on trees, we will, during the month of October, think about the ways in which we live with one another, both individually and as a community. We'll spend several Sundays talking about money (and what role money plays in our life). And at the end of the month, we'll have a small celebration recognizing those who have given to our newly formed legacy endowment.

I am proud of you, Community. Several individuals and families, after listening to the costs we incur as a faith community, made a donation "above and beyond" their normal levels of giving. For this, I give thanks. It is an honor to serve a church where the giving of gifts can be discussed freely, faithfully, and without fear.


