MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

Dear Community,

In today's article I want to draw your attention to three upcoming events in the life of our church: the capital campaign; the community garden; and Vacation Bible School. So...let's begin.

- By now, a brochure should have arrived in your mailbox outlining the goals for our "Clearly Seeing 20/20" capital campaign. It is very exciting to think that by the end of this calendar year we can achieve our realistic goal of being completely debt free. With an absence of debt we will not only save money on interest, but also have more financial flexibility for continued ministry initiatives and property maintenance. Every dollar received is significant. Please prayerfully consider your financial contribution over the coming weeks.
- The community garden is in formation. Now that we have the proper approval and permits from the city of Manchester we are fine tuning our planning and design. Next Friday, we will meet with St. Louis native and gardening expert Matt Lebon—owner of Custom Foodscaping—to ensure all of the details are in place (it turns out that designing an urban garden is quite complex) and that our long range plans are both realistic and achievable. In initial conversations, Matt affirmed that we are on the right path and was impressed with our biblical approach to community gardening—take what you need, share what you can. We feel confident that by this fall we will be able to host a fall harvest party with the fruits of our labor.
- Planning has begun for Vacation Bible School. This is always a fun time to grow in Christian community with our children, youth and adults. If you have not registered, please consider doing so soon. For me, I always enjoy listening to my children sing the songs with the accompanying cd's both long before and long after the actual VBS.

These three items are just a brief snapshot of our busy life here at Community. I am very grateful for the success of the recent Stable Sale, the huge number of hours volunteered, and the relationships that are formed, renewed, and celebrated. We also recently hosted the Bethany Fellows (forty young ministers from across the nation) to share the steps we took in becoming an Open and Affirming Congregation, watched an excellent performance by the God's Kids Choir, recognized the graduation of our seniors, and are working (as I write) to complete the installation of the new screen in the sanctuary.
