MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

Dear Community Family and Friends:

Have you ever played the childhood game *Concentration*? The goal is pretty simple. A deck of cards is randomly distributed face down and each player takes turns trying to find a matching pair. For my children, *Concentration* is a game of utter frustration and total jubilation. For me, I have lately come to see the game in the larger context of life.

In February, we celebrated Ash Wednesday. There, as we do each year, we remembered the words of the psalmist: "Purge me with hyssop and make me clean." Then, while attending our latest senior citizen luncheon with a guest lecturer presenting the plants of the Bible, I heard the word again—hyssop. It was a match.

I thought about this match, and plant, as we made the first eight beds of our community garden this past Sunday. In the Jewish tradition, hyssop is a plant that is used, as the psalmist suggests, in the ritual of purification. Hyssop is a means to remembering that we are the creature, not the Creator. We are all perfectly imperfect and made perfect by God. As we shoveled the soil, topped the beds with compost, made new friends from the wider community, and even planted a few onions to start things off, I reveled in the power of the soil where, as proclaimed in the book of Genesis, life begins.

Sometimes this simple work of moving soil, compost, and mulch can create the largest rewards. It's paradoxical, but true. Fewer distractions create a larger awareness of the Spirit.

As we live into this practice of collective community gardening, I invite you not only to help us plant, grow and harvest vegetables, but also to dive deeper into the Divine Mystery, found in the soil, the compost, and the plants. Together, with one another and with God, we are a match.

SUMMER MISSION TRIP SUPPORT

Dear CCC,

I hope this letter finds you well! I wanted to bring you up to date on what has been happening in my life recently. I am currently a sophomore at Maryville University, where I am studying to be a middle school English teacher. I am involved in many clubs activities, including Community Service Club, Maryville Student Government, and Best Buddies. One of my most treasured roles, though, is a student leader and treasure for Cru, a Christian organization on campus that provides a caring, compassionate community committed to connecting students to Jesus.



As I have been involved in Cru on campus, the Lord has been growing my in my faith and trust in Him a lot. I have gotten to do a lot with this group, such as a service trip to New Orleans, conferences where I've learned from the Bible, and being involved in Christian community on campus where we can learn to walk with God together. God has been working in my life these past four semesters, helping me grow not only as a leader but as a Christian. As I have been involved, God has really shown me the value of investing in my own faith, but also the importance and calling that God has given us of helping others know and love Christ too.

This summer, I have been given the opportunity to participate in a summer mission trip to Ecuador. We are going to be sharing on college campuses and although the country is highly Catholic, students don't have a personal relationship with God. Our goal will be to share our faith and help them grow in their relationship with Christ. Although this step of faith is scary, I am extremely excited to have the opportunity for Jesus to use me to change someone's life forever.

We will be in Ecuador for 6 weeks, from May 17th to July 1st. In order for this trip to be possible however, I need to raise a team of ministry partners who will come alongside me both prayerfully and financially. I need a total of \$4,750 by May 17th, which covers airfare, room and board, and all other expenses.
