#### MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER

Dear Church:

We wait anxiously to resume attending in-person worship and church ministries/ activities. It will be so good when we are able to see our church family, break bread at the communion table, and worship in the sanctuary as one. But we are not there yet.

In the state of Missouri, St. Louis County has one of the highest rates of Covid-19 infections. Phased reopening plans developed by public health experts call for several benchmarks to indicate safety: fourteen days of declining case counts, widespread testing, and contact tracing.

The latest numbers from the St. Louis Metropolitan Pandemic Task Force show a slight decrease in the number of cases and average hospitalizations.

The health and safety of each of you is our number one priority.

We are using the following questions as a means of guiding our response to resuming worship:

How will we maintain an online streaming option once we resume worship?

- How many people can our sanctuary hold if we worship as families and maintain social distance guidelines?
- How will we discourage the receiving line after church and/or congregating after worship in the narthex?
- How will Sunday School classes and children attending the nursery meet safely in the same place?
- In the early phases of relaunch, how will we cap attendance at events?
- How will we ensure sanitation and disinfection in regards to communal spaces?
- How will we update our building use agreements with outside groups to reflect the new realities of COVID-19?
- If someone contracts COVID-19, how will we communicate this information while maintaining privacy and pastoral care?
- If someone who has been in our building contracts COVID-19, how will we do a more intensive cleaning prior to its next use?
- How will we communicate our safety plan and best practices to the congregation and those who use our buildings?

- What does our insurance company recommend in terms of benchmarks for reopening, and resuming ministries?
- When is it safe/appropriate to host the Stable sale?

Clearly, there are a number of issues and questions to address. However, with God's guidance, and the leadership of the CLT, Elders, Staff, and Volunteers, I am confident that we will discern the best plan possible. Once we have more information and answers to the questions above, we will share via email, website, and letter.

In the meantime, please feel free to contact me if you have any questions, suggestions, or simply want to be in conversation. I pray for each of you daily and miss our in-person worship tremendously.





As of April 30, the current pandemic has not taken too much of a toll on our general offering. We have started to feel the effect of reduced rental income from no use by outside groups of the main building and Wunderlich Family Life Center since mid March. Some expenses have been lower due to the pandemic and lack of weekly activity in our buildings. We have continued to pay all staff salaries at their budgeted amounts.

On May 1 we received a Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan of \$23,400. This amount will assist in our payment of payroll and certain other eligible expenses over the course of the next 8 weeks.

In April we were able to have the parking lot potholes filled in and have the entire lot sealed and striped.

Your continued financial support by mail or use of online giving will help us maintain ongoing operating expenses as well as budgeted outreach and mission contributions.
