MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Church,

Fifteen years ago I was ordained into the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

The ordination took place in the church where I grew up, First Christian Church in St. Joseph, MO. I will be forever indebted to the fine people of FCC who nurtured my call to ministry, both as a child and, later, as a young adult.

The text I chose to have read at the ordination came from the prophet Micah. Micah, a prophet from the Old Testament, used words to help remake and renew the world. Words for prophets are inspired by God and meant to reenergize and rebuild—especially in times of disaster and mistrust. In the sixth chapter of Micah, the prophet says, "With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?" He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you, but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

It's a simple message, really. Do what is fair and just to your neighbor, be compassionate and loyal in your love, and don't take yourself too seriously—take God seriously.

Sometimes, in these present days of unrest, I need to remind myself of these plain, yet profound, truths of old. I pray that I can continue to live into this vision of what God requests and that we, as a community of faith, can help participate in, remake, and renew the world.

I am grateful to each of you for this journey of ministry—the journey of seeking to follow, as fellow believers, in the Word of Christ.
