MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community,

This year continues to be a year of pivoting and flexibility. And after prayerful conversation, we are announcing yet another change: Our Christmas Eve service will be online only.

We did not arrive at this decision easily. Singing "Silent Night" in the sacredness of our sanctuary is one of the hallmarks of our faith and foundation. But with the rising cases of Covid, along with the recommendations of the public health department, and the logistics involved for multiple services with fluctuating attendance, we believe that having an online service is the safest option for all involved.

While it will be different, we are working hard to assure the Christmas Eve service will still be meaningful. I am excited for the special music, participation of our youth, and the promises of God made known once again. In keeping with the traditional times, we will have the "live" service at 3:30 and 7:00 on Facebook and YouTube.

We will also have an online service only on the Sunday following Christmas, December 27<sup>th</sup>. And finally, we will return to in-person worship on January 3<sup>rd</sup>.

On a slightly different note, I want to thank each of you for the incredible generosity shown during this season of Advent. The Christmas cheer from Community has been shared in so many ways: decorations of Christmas tree door hangers for a local nursing home, collections of gift cards for the children at Columbia Elementary School, presents for the children and youth of Urban ReachSTL, and the cash donations for clients from Circle of Concern. It is a joy to participate in such a caring church. Thank you!

### THANKSGIVING CRAFTS FOR WEST COUNTY CARE CENTER




A. Gray (pictured above) helped assemble some of the turkey decorations.
