MESSAGE FROM OUR JUNE SABBATICAL MINISTER, REV. JOHN YONKER

Dear Church:

In my first sermon delivered on June 6th, entitled "A High Calling," I pointed out that in the early centuries the church developed orders of ministry, deacons, elders, pastors and bishops which soon became paid ministers. But I mentioned these "professional ministers" were not the only "ministers" of the church, for as Jesus has called women from their fields and kitchens, and men from their fishing boats to follow him to become his ministers to share the good news of God's love revealed through Christ, so God has called us all to become Jesus' ministers. And in the three weeks I have come to preach for Jacob Thorne, I have already seen how you all have become ministers of Jesus Christ.

At the Core Leadership Team meeting held last Monday evening in the library we talked about the business of the church, going through the agenda which Cheryl Kinney put together, but we ended talking about getting back to normal, with a celebration when Jacob returns in September. Finally, we talked about contacting some of the people to help them welcome back to in-person worship after we have all been vaccinated.

I have known some of your ministers, and several members of your church through my connections with Disciples of Christ congregations through the years, including my home church, the Hamilton Christian Church where I was born and raised, and some of your families which are in the First Christian Church of Columbia.

I encourage you to make telephone calls to some of your friends whom you have not seen in several months, who have stayed away during the pandemic, and I even encourage you to make calls on your family members who have stayed away for the same reason. Also, I encourage you to pray for those who are on the prayer list, to hold them up in prayer for help and healing.

You have my highest regard for allowing Jacob a three-month sabbatical. I had two three-months sabbaticals while Sarah and I served the First Christian Church in Columbia and after both I came back refreshed and renewed, with new energy to continue working in the ministry for Jesus Christ. I am honored that he has asked me to fill in for him while he is away. I hope to see you in church!
