#### MESSAGE FROM OUR JULY SABBATICAL MINISTER, REV. JOSEPH CLEGG

I didn't plan to say the phrase "you are no longer strangers" from the pulpit this past Sunday as I began my time with you supplying for Jacob during his sabbatical. The words from Ephesians 2 talk about the reconciliation of Jews and Gentiles and about a division that was healed. I chuckled as I looked back over the passage today from this past Sunday, because I could also say that "you are no longer strangers" to me. I feel acclimated to Community Christian from my times with you over the past few months. I'm still learning many of your names, of course, and meeting many of you for the first time. I may not meet some of you, as you continue to worship with us from home. However, I am glad to be able to mingle with and talk to others now in ways that were harder and less safe in the previous months. I feel a little less like your guest pastor swooping in and a little more like your companions.

Have you thought more about companionship during the past year than you ever have? I know that I've thought about it more. Some of us are born extroverts, some natural introverts, some ambiverts who seem to need company one day and solitude the next. Our times of isolation and virtual meetings during the past year have shown us again that God gives us companionship as a gift. After all, God desires OUR companionship. What else is the work of the church but believing and working as God's companions? But in that work, we become companions of each other as well. We can't be otherwise, in fact.

"In [Christ], the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord" (Eph. 2:21), we're told. What's joined together? You and me. As I mentioned on Sunday, "fitted together" may be a better translation, and Paul is using a term masons used to describe the whole process of fitting stones together. We are companions, but that doesn't mean everything automatically comes together smoothly. Sometimes, we need to be fitted a little more. Sometimes, the surfaces make the building process more difficult.

In some ways, this summer's surfaces merely have a different roughness than last summer's. We wait for the inevitable rise of Delta-variant COVID cases; children return to a school that's unrecognizable to them, and a safety that's uncertain to them. Our political discourse isn't getting any better. And- as God has for two millennia, God keeps building with us, fitting us together for good works. I look forward to being "joined together" with you and being your companions through the next weeks, as I learn more about you, hear your stories, see your calling and ministry in action- and God keeps doing its building with us.

We had 10 children, 2 youth helpers and 5 adults enjoy an afternoon of VBS fun on July 11th. The focus was 1 Corinthians 15:57 - "thanks be to God who gives us the victory, through our Lord Jesus Christ". We used the Olympic theme to support this verse. As an outreach project we decorated bags, filled them with snacks and crafts and delivered them to the families at Hanna Woods. The financial results for the first half of 2021 are going well. We are on target with respect to offering donations and use of the gym continues on a nearly daily basis which has led to higher gym rental income than anticipated.

We continue to watch expenses and have had few unexpected items pop up so far this year. When the recent HVAC inspection was done, we learned of a need for some new replacement parts, but that work has not been done yet due to supply shortages.

Outreach giving during this past quarter went to Disciples Mission Fund, Christian Church of Mid America, Caring Solutions, Circle of Concern, AllianceQ, Global Ministries and the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

If you are planning to make an IRA withdrawal and have it sent directly to the church, please contact the church office so that we can be looking for your donation. Year to date giving statements will be sent out in early August. We are grateful for your financial giving in support of CCC and its ministries throughout the year.
