Dear Church Family:

At the end of this month, on the Sunday that is also Halloween, we will celebrate All Saints' Day. The word Halloween comes from the term "All Hallows Eve," which marks October 31st as the eve of All Saints' Day.

All Saints' Day, which takes place on the first of November, was originally created by the Roman Catholics as a way to honor all of the saints who have gone before and, especially, those saints who do not have a designated feast day during the calendar year. As Protestants, we have adopted this tradition, marking the day as a time when we affirm that, with the grace of God, we can all be saints in the making.

When I think of saints in the making, I can't help but think of the many fine folks here at Community Christian Church. There are so many ways that the people of our community help one another: offering meals for those who are sick, providing transportation to the doctor, mowing the grounds of our church to keep it beautiful and sacred, serving the community through our Stable sale, praying for one another, singing in celebration, and celebrating both life and death, to name just a few. And in those little acts of goodness, we plant the seeds of faith.

The nineteenth century pastor, poet, and song-writer, Phillips Brooks, who happened to write the hymn, "O Little Town of Bethlehem," was once asked: "Why are you a Christian?" Brooks pondered the question for a few moments, and then replied with utmost seriousness, "I am a Christian because of my Aunt Tillie, who lives in Teaneck, New Jersey."

I never met the Aunt Tillie that Brooks refers to. But I have met many "Aunt Tillie's" here at Community. To all of those in this community who are the unspoken heroes of our faith, know and rejoice that you are, indeed, saints in the making.

May we all, strive to be the Aunt Tillie's of the world.
