Dear Community,

Next Wednesday marks the start of the season of Lent.

Our Ash Wednesday service, which begins at 7:00, takes its name from the ceremonial imposition of ashes on the foreheads (or wrists) of worshipers—serving as a sign of both our sin and mortality. This ancient tradition, dating back to at least the tenth century, is intended to be a time of both individual and communal reflection.

Traditionally, Lent is a time where we make sacrifices in our life (such as giving up something special for the forty days of Lent) in order to help us become more aware of Christ's sacrifice for humanity. The practice of sacrifice is important. This year however, I challenge each of us to also add the spiritual practice of saying The Lord's Prayer at least once per day—or, if you're really up for a challenge, as many as three times per day. When said with intention and purpose, the Lord's Prayer can lead us more directly to God and to one another.

And, if you are interested in learning more about The Lord's Prayer, and how it may apply to the specifics of your life, consider joining us for a Tuesday evening session, starting March 1<sup>st</sup>, that I will be leading—details of the class are included in this newsletter.


As always, I look forward to once again sharing the season of Lent with one another.




### PRISCILLA WOMEN'S GROUP
