MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community:

I want to share with you a number of exciting updates.

First, after interviewing several qualified candidates we are pleased to announce that Becky Sternitzky has accepted the position to be our next Office Manager.

Since 2000, Becky has worked in the field of healthcare management. We are excited that her exceptional interpersonal skills, with a passion for improving patient experience, physician engagement, operational improvement, and organizational effectiveness will all serve to make her a perfect match with Community. And, as an added bonus, Becky is already familiar with our church and ministries. Becky's sister is Laura McDurmont! Becky's official start date is July 5th. She will be in the office most days from 9:00-3:00, Monday thru Friday.

At the same time I am also excited to share that Beth will still remain on staff, but in a bit of a different role. Finally, I want to share some updates on the garden. We are thrilled that the garden expansion is on its way to completion. The new fencing has been installed and we are now in the process of building additional beds and pathways, along with a new system for watering and irrigation. The other news is that while our partnership with UrbanReachSTL (URSTL) remains strong, we have had to make some pivots and adjustments. Our original intent was to have the youth from URSTL join us one morning a week for gardening, lunch, and fellowship. Unfortunately, due to a shortage of both staffing and volunteers, URSTL has had to make significant adjustments and eliminations to their programming this summer, including not being able to bring youth to the garden. However, we are still planning to provide fresh produce for their weekly community meals, along with establishing a set time for volunteers from Community to serve, and hope to have all of the new details in place by the end of this week. And then, looking already to next summer, plan once again to have the youth from URSTL join us in the garden.

As you can see, we have a lot taking place this summer and my words cover only a small part of what is continually taking place. Other notable events over the next few weeks include: celebrations of our graduating seniors (this Sunday, May 22nd); a special Memorial Day Celebration with a live twenty-piece band led by Jerry Hoover (May 29th); and the celebration and act of baptism on Pentecost Sunday (June 5th).

I am so grateful for this church and its many ministries and missions.

This week we donated almost 5 pounds of produce to Circle of Concern, including lettuce, swiss chard, beet tops, snap peas and cilantro.
