MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community,

While writing this article, thoughts about our dear friend and brother-in-Christ, Carl Quicksall, swirl through my mind.

I had the privilege to know Carl best through the many fishing trips we took with one another. And on our drives to Bennet Springs, or Montauk, or a lake in Illinois, Carl would regale me with stories of growing up in Kentucky, traveling the world for his career, and, most importantly, spending time with his family.

Carl also shared with me the number of times he had been seriously ill. If I remember correctly, he had a heart attack at a fairly young age and then, later in life, a liver disease that eventually led to a liver transplant. I guess you could say Carl came closer to death more often than most. And yet, the closer to death he became, the more fully he lived.

It's human nature to think that first we live then we die. But Jesus turns it around and teaches us the paradox of the Christian life. In order to live, says Jesus, you first have to prepare to die. Jesus leads us to the death of illusions, the death of self-will, and even the death of sin. The earlier we learn these self-imposed deaths the more fully we live life.

So when Carl told me several weeks before his death that he was not scared, I was not surprised. From a young age, growing up at Beargrass Christian Church in Kentucky, Carl had already been preparing for this moment. Carl taught us all, family and church, how to live and how to die.

And now, Carl has entered into the gates of heaven and I give thanks for his life here on this earth and forevermore.
