MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community,

This Sunday is "Pledge Sunday."

Jesus talked a lot about money. In fact, more than half of his parables focus on the right and wrong attitudes towards money. Jesus saw nothing wrong with those who were financially successful. And Jesus never singled out those who had many possessions. But Jesus did warn about the perils of how we make money, how we hoard money, and how we can fall into the trap of putting money above all else in life. But even with all of the warnings, Jesus proclaims, over and over, that money can also be used for the benefit of all of God's people.

This year, I have seen the many ways that money, given to our church, has benefitted all of God's people.

I watched as the seeds that we purchased were planted in the soil and transitioned into plants bearing fruit. Most of the produce we grew and harvested, almost seven hundred pounds to date, went to Circle of Concern where it was given to those facing food insecurity. But some of the produce landed on the kitchen table at UrbanReachSTL where children and youth devoured fresh tomatoes and cucumbers.

I witnessed a family in need receive an air conditioner from the Stable, for free, in the middle of a terrible heat wave that threatened the health and well-being of their family.

I was humbled by an unexpected donation, from a non-church member, that enabled us to remodel the bathrooms in DeWitt Hall.

And I was amazed by the continual support and gifts, in terms of both finances and personal presence, that each of you give, over and over, for the benefit of our community.

In an era when many churches worry about closing, I give thanks to God that we are building, thriving, and growing. And again, this is only possible because each of you manage so carefully and wisely the abundant resources that God has given so freely. All that we have and all that we are comes from God. And you, truly, are stewards of God's gifts.

Thank you for committing once again to the financial health of Community Christian Church.



Our operating expenses have continued to be less that anticipated, primarily because costly property expenses have not been needed and fewer needs for children and youth ministry.

Outreach giving during the quarter went to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, Circle of Concern, Caring Solutions, Christian Church of Mid-America, Disciples Mission Fund, Loaves and Fishes, Heifer International and New Horizon Church International (for assistance with clean water in Jackson, Mississippi).

We hope you've noticed the new black gum trees recently planted between the CCC parking lot and the Journey parking lot.
