MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community,

In today's article I want to offer a brief "State of the Union for Community Christian Church."

Overall, we are in a very good position in terms of worship, financial giving, ministry, and mission.

Our worship continues to be creative, engaging, and welcoming. We have new visitors on a regular basis and look forward to marking intentional times of the liturgical year, such as the upcoming season of lent. The challenge with worship, and this dovetails with mission as well, is to find ways to connect with those visiting and have them return on a regular basis.

A summary of the financial giving for 2022 is presented in this copy of the Vital Spark. We ended the year with a surplus of \$31,000. This is a call for celebration—especially when so many churches are struggling to meet their financial obligations—and more than enough to cover the expected budget deficit of \$29,500 for the 2023 fiscal year. However, an emphasis on financial giving, and the reasons for doing so, will need to be continued in the future. I will offer some sermons later this fall on the connection between faith and finances.

In terms of ministry and mission, I believe we are thriving. I am so proud of the work that each of you do every single week to make Community Christian Church a beacon light. You are truly, as Jesus says, the salt of the earth. This year will see a continued emphasis with The Stable, The Bremer Community Garden, UrbanReachSTL, community gatherings (both within and beyond the walls of our church), and partnerships with local non-profits and organizations. The challenge will be to make sure we include as many individuals as possible in these events - including the new faces seen at worship on Sunday morning.

As we enter our tenth year now as pastor and congregation, I am more grateful than ever to be in ministry here at Community. This past decade has no doubt seen changes and challenges, but I am just as excited now as I was so long ago.


Vision Performing Arts High School), and the orchestra students of Parkway Central High School who helped serve the chili!


Seniors Luncheon
