MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community,

According to the church calendar this Sunday is "Ascension Sunday." Occurring one week before Pentecost, Ascension Sunday marks the time when Jesus "ascends" into the heavens. The disciples are left staring into the sky and wondering what happens next.

What happens next will be the focus of Sunday' sermon, but here's a preview—the disciples find themselves living as witnesses to the ways in which God's Spirit currently works.

This concept of witnessing to God's ways has become especially clear to me over these past two weeks as we have interviewed candidates for our Office and Building Manager Position. In both sharing with the candidates, and listening to others involved in the interviewing process, I am amazed, over and over, at how much ministry our church does. We are truly witnesses for Christ in all that we do and are. Here are just a few quick examples:

- Our Stable Crew had an incredibly successful spring sale. We not only helped others in need, but also served as witnesses of Christ to each person who walked through the door.
- Our garden has a new volunteer who discovered us because of our fresh food they received as a client at Circle of Concern. They have joined us to witness and participate in growing food and serving others.
- Our own John Houghton will give a presentation this Saturday at the Men's Breakfast (where women are also invited) witnessing to his life of faith and the time he spent in the Air Force.
- Our partners in ministry, UrbanReachSTL, will have their summer kickoff this Saturday (volunteers are still needed) and will witness to the community members the goodness and love of Christ.
- Our building continues to be a meeting place for so many individuals and groups, serving as a place of witness for safety and security.
- Our Elders are hosting another evening of prayer, witnessing to God's presence and praying for God's children, on June 1st from 6:00-9:00 p.m.

The list could go on and on, but the idea is clear. We are indeed serving as witnesses of Christ at Community Christian Church and for this I give thanks to God.
