MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community,

This Sunday will be our final sermon in the series, "What Death Teaches about Life." Then, on September 10th, we will start a new journey in the Bible using what is called the Narra-tive Lectionary.

This style of lectionary, used increasingly by many churches, rotates through a four year cycle of biblical readings. In each of four years, the Narrative Lectionary tells the biblical story from start to finish—starting in Genesis each September, working through the Old Testament until Christmas, and then moving to one of the Gospels and the Book of Acts, in spring.

It's been a few years since we used the narrative lectionary schedule in worship, but I look forward to finding our stories in the narrative of God's story and not being able to skip some of the more challenging texts of the Bible.

I also want to note that most of the time I will be preaching from the new and updated version of the NRSV, officially called the NRSVue.

Completed in 2021, the NRSVue has made 12,000 changes in its latest version. Some of these changes are long needed. For example, in the New Testament the Greek word *adelphoi* has been translated as "brothers" in the past, but it also can mean "brothers and sisters;" the newer version adjusts for such changes. There is also an effort to use less archaic language. In the NRSV, Jesus cleanses "a leper." The NRSVue changes it to "a man with a skin disease."

It is my hope and prayer that these updates, combined with academic study and personal reflection, will only deepen the influence that scripture has on our lives. And if you have any questions, please let me know.

As always, I look forward to seeing you on Sunday mornings. Worshipping with one another is one of the constant highlights of my week.

Garden Updates

The garden produce is donated to Circle of Concern and also to families of Hanna Woods.

In 2023 we have donated 333 lbs of produce. This includes 92 lbs. of tomatoes, 27 lbs. of beans, 19 lbs. of carrots, and 12 lbs. of spinach. We are planning to plant lettuce and beets soon so that they can be harvested this fall. We will also be planting garlic to harvest next summer!
