MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear Community,

This past week, with the death of my mother, I was reminded once again of a fact that I already knew: The words of scripture are never more true than when standing at the graveside of a loved one. Death, promises God, will never have the final word.

First, I want to thank each and every one of you for all of the prayers, cards, kind words, and support. I do not know how an individual could go through this process of grieving without having a church community for support. It has been so comforting knowing that my family has been held in prayer.

Second, I want to thank Don Miller and Penny Ross-Corona for preaching on such short notice. Between having COVID and being present for my mom's death, I have been absent from the pulpit more than I would have liked (I really missed being there for Christmas Eve). But, and I think this speaks such huge volumes about the strength of our church, the ministry, mission, and business of the church has carried on without any flaws. Watching online, I was struck by the stellar worship, preaching and music. And I am extremely grateful for the tireless efforts of Beth and Katie. Because of our office staff, we are starting the New Year in a good position. I have always believed that a healthy church should be able to function well with the unplanned absence of a minister and this has certainly been the case.

Third, and finally, I want to share with you that I know now what the death of a parent feels like. I have done dozens of funerals for those who have lost a parent. And now, having experienced it myself, I have a much better understanding of the role of grief, the role of a pastor, and the role of a church. All three, for the pastor, work, I pray, to provide a time of both mourning and a celebration of life. Please know that I will always be there for you, just as you have been there for me.

I look forward to seeing each of you this Sunday and being back at church!
