MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER, REV. JACOB THORNE

Dear friends,

As we step into the month of June, I want to share a few updates—and a few reflections from the heart.

First, a note about the Sundays ahead: I'll be away from the pulpit on May 25, June 15, and June 22. I'm so grateful for the leaders within our congregation who are stepping forward to share the Word during this time. Penny Ross-Corona will be preaching on May 25, Betty Quicksall on June 15, and Doug Hoover on June 22. It is a gift to serve in a church where people are willing and able to share their voices and offer the congregation a fresh word. Their generosity also gives me time for rest and renewal—something I don't take for granted.

Before these Sundays away, we'll gather for Pentecost Sunday on June 8—a celebration of wind and fire, of courage and birth, of the Spirit descending on ordinary people and making something extraordinary. Pentecost reminds us that the church began not in silence or structure, but in holy chaos and connection. It's the perfect Sunday to wear red, sing boldly, and remember that the Spirit is still moving among us.

But even as we look forward, I want to acknowledge the heartbreak so many in our area are feeling after the tornadoes last Friday night. Two of our sister congregations were hit hard—Centennial Christian Church was completely destroyed, along with the loss of life, and Union Avenue Christian Church suffered extensive damage, including the loss of 47 windows. It is hard to see such devastation, especially in places we know and love.

Like many of you, I've struggled to make sense of it. I've returned to the writings of Rabbi Harold Kushner, who after losing his son to a rare illness, gave voice to a theology many of us carry deep inside. Kushner reminded us that God does not cause tragedy—but also doesn't always intervene to prevent it. There are natural laws at work in the world—storms form, winds gather, and sometimes destruction comes.

But God is not absent in those moments. As Kushner wrote, God gives us the grace to handle what life brings us, and surrounds us with people to carry the weight when we cannot. I believe that deeply. I see it in the way neighbors have responded, in the churches that have reached out, in the prayers being spoken and the hands being offered. God gave us each other.

Kushner's words don't answer every question, but they help us hold space for the hardest ones.

As we move through this season—Pentecost, rest, rebuilding—may we listen for the Spirit in the wind, and look for God's presence in the people who show up.

News from the Mission Team

Over the last two summers, we donated cereal to Circle of Concern and to Feed My People. This summer, we are introducing a new giving opportunity for the months of June and July.

We will be participating in Isaiah 58's "Bag of Blessings" project. Isaiah 58 has provided a list of items divided into four categories: food, pantry items, personal care items, and cleaning supplies. The list reflects the highest identified needs of the ministry.

Items needed for June are the following:

- tuna
- canned ravioli with meat
- coffee
- tea
- diapers (sizes 5, 6, 4T, 5T)
- baby wipes
- multi/all-purpose cleaner

Starting in June, please choose the items on the

list that you would like to provide and place your bag of blessings in the marked basket in the Mission Corner of the Narthex. A printed list of requested items will also be available there.

As reflected in the above table, our church operations through April 30th are very close to break even, and better than the budgeted deficit.

We are happy to report that the flat roof portion of our main building was replaced last week, funded by stable ministry and your building enhancement donations. Thank you!

From the Garden

Our garden is really looking good after recent rains and plenty of sunshine in the past week. We have shared over 10 pounds of strawberries with Circle of Concern in the past 10 days and a nice amount of kale and swiss chard as well. In addition, we have recently planted tomatoes, peppers, basil, thyme, rosemary, parsley, eggplant, lettuce and green beans. And there will be cucumbers, okra and more to plant next week.
